Our conference is located in the heart of Hollywood, which has a wealth of film history and sights to see within walking distance or a short ride on the Los Angeles Metro. There are many lessons Los Angeles has for the future of local politics across the country.

THE THEME FOR THE 2014 MEETING: THE POWER OF INFORMATION

In a world where ideas, thoughts, insights, and calls for actions can be transferred in a nano-second across the globe, the study of what drives this transference and the impact it has for people, institutions, governments, and the world community become even more important endeavors for social scientists to investigate. We must challenge old theories, look at diverse contexts, learn from comparative contexts and cases, and glean knowledge about what predictions or conclusions can be drawn about our political world as a result.

Twenty-first century politics, more than any other, challenges us to make sense of and derive meaning from the cacophony of voices that fill the political space each day; regardless of borders, time, context, and status of relations. Already this century we have witnessed as information unleashed has led to awakenings across the world, from the Arab Spring; to the EU re-negotiations; to new coalitions built across age,

race, class, gender and sexual orientation; to the continued dialogue over world-wide power; and the future metrics by which we measure such. It is within this world of information “chaos,” political scientists can be the deciphers of orders and patterns that help to make sense of not only the information, but the meaning of the events that unfold and how political actors can function and be relevant in an ever-changing reality.

As we gather in area of our country with a long history of supporting information literacy (2013 marks the 145th anniversary of the formation of Seattle's first library association and the 125th anniversary of the formation of the Ladies Library Association, whose efforts resulted in creating the Seattle Public Library) and some of the most successful businesses in the modern era of information technology (e.g., Microsoft, Amazon.com), we as social scientists need to not merely think in the Kuhnian sense of incrementalism and the creation of new paradigms, but rather in a manner that allows for cross-pollination of ideas and information among sub-fields, between disciplines, and between nations. We invite panels and paper proposals that explore the power of information in the political context, including how information is generated, communicated, and acted upon; the relation of information to other forms of political power; methodological innovations allowing us to measure the power of information; and teaching pedagogies that enable our students to become better consumers and producers of information.

Please join us at the 2014 Western Political Science Association Annual Meeting in Seattle where information will flow like Starbucks and Seattle's Best Coffee, and the ideas will rise like the Cascade and Olympic Mountains.

Although Los Angeles is traditionally known for its traffic, there are many places you can reach that don't require you to have a car. The Los Angeles Metro is clean, generally quiet and runs until 2 am, when bars and clubs close down. We have geared our suggestions to the subway infrastructure to minimize our carbon footprint and identified which Metro station is closest. We have included things that are worth the car or cab ride as well; "short," "medium" and "long" is based on both distance and likely traffic obstacles.

Our hotel, the Loews, is attached to Hollywood and Highland, (hollywoodhighland.com) shopping and dining facility and the Dolby Theater, home to the Academy Awards. It features a variety of chain restaurants for dine in and dine out, including California Pizza Kitchen (request Badger for takeout), Rolling Stone Magazine Restaurant, Johnny Rockets, and many others. There is plenty of shopping as well featuring well-known brands.

We use some LA shorthand, like "precious people," which is a euphemism for the kind of stereotypically snobbish crowd that LA is often stereotyped to feature, and include some celebrity sighting spots and local filming locations as well. Filming can be exciting when there is a celebrity of interest, but can also tie up traffic and change parking availability, so we wanted everyone to be forewarned. The signs for filming are yellow with large black letters often written as code words.

Baco Mercat (bacomercat.com) (4 blocks from Pershing Square, Red Line Stop) Mediterranean. According to *Bon Appetit* magazine, the best new restaurant in the U.S.

Bottega Louie (bottegalouie.com/main.html) (2 blocks from 7th Street /Metro Center, Red Line stop) Italian. Restaurant with a large menu and attached patisserie.

Cicada (cicadarestaurant.com/index.php) (three blocks from Pershing Square, Red Line stop) Italian. An Art Deco-style restaurant with a vintage nightclub "dinner and swing dancing" option on weekend nights called Max DeMille's Cicada Club.

Drago Centro (dragocentro.com) (long walk from Pershing Square, Red Line stop) Italian. Excellent happy hour hors d'oeuvres and Italian wine selections. The butternut squash soup and the gorganelli pasta are wonderful.

The Gorbals (thegorbalsla.com) (2 blocks from Pershing Square, Red Line Stop) New American. Chef Ilan Hall won Bravo TV's "Top Chef" competition at the age of 24. Has a speakeasy vibe.

Perch (perchla.com) (1 block from Pershing Square, Red line Stop) French. Great views at sunset – old school inside, outside patio, food is pretty good.

Philippe the Original (philippes.com) (short walk from Union Station, Red Line Stop) French. Sandwich Shop Downtown LA landmark serving French dip sandwiches.

Spice Table (thespicetable.com) (short walk from Little Tokyo, Gold Line stop) Southeast Asian. Upscale small plates approach to Singaporean and Vietnamese cuisine.

Urrth Café (urthcaffe.com) (medium cab ride from Union Station, Red Line Stop) Organic, Vegan. Great brunch option – hipster version of the more precious people restaurant in West Hollywood in LA's Arts District -- a rapidly changing part of downtown LA.

Hollywood / West Hollywood (closest to hotel; look for activities with a Δ)

Aroma Café (aromabakery.com/losangeles.php) (short cab ride from hotel) Bakery/Bistro. Great outdoor seating right on Sunset Boulevard, huge salads and great cakes.

Birds Café-Bar (birdshollywood.com) (Long walk or short cab ride from hotel) American Rotisserie. A hip Hollywood restaurant with delicious roast chicken. Make sure to order extra dipping sauce on the side.

Bossa Nova (bossanovafood.com) (long walk or short cab ride from hotel) Brazilian. Great reasonably priced food open late on weekends – try the plantains!

Delancey's Bar and Pizzeria (delanceyhollywood.com) (long walk or short cab ride) Pizza/Italian. Open late, part local pizzeria, part rustic East Coast Italian. The pizza is good.

The Farmer's Kitchen (long walk or short cab ride; located in Sunset and Vine complex near Arclight cinemas) A nonprofit community development corporation dedicated to providing local food sources. One of Hollywood's best lunch spots, also open for breakfast on Sunday ONLY.

The Formosa Café – an industry legacy too cool to have a website (cab ride) Chinese. Across the street from the Samuel Goldwyn studio (now known as "The Lot") where "True Blood" is filmed, this restaurant is well-known for nearly a century's worth of celebrity patronage, from Humphrey Bogart to Britney Spears. 7516 Santa Monica Blvd., 323-850-9050.

Hungry Cat (thehungrycat.com) Hollywood (long walk or short cab ride) Seafood and Raw Bar. A seafood and raw bar in the courtyard of the Sunset and Vine complex.

Jones Café – too cool to have a website (medium cab ride) The Jones Café has great thin crust pizza and an amazing apple pie a la mode. It is located in West Hollywood: 7205 Santa Monica Boulevard, 323-850-1726. It is located across the street from the studio where "True Blood" is filmed so look out for Anna Paquin or Joe Manganiello.

Pink's Hot Dogs (pinkshollywood.com) (medium cab ride from hotel) American. An LA tradition akin to New York's Nathan's Famous Coney Island Dogs. Beware the line around the corner, which starts with early lunch!

Pizzeria Mozza (pizzeriamozza.com) (short cab ride from hotel) – Italian. No reservations casual dining sibling of Osteria Mozza. Same location, separate entrances.

Stout Burgers and Beers (stoutburgersandbeers.com) (long walk/short cab ride) American. Does both of these things really well Street (CG).

Tender Greens Hollywood (tendergreensfood.com) (long walk) American. Great salad place that's not too far from the conference hotel.

△ **ArcLight Cinemas Hollywood**

Home to the Cineramadome, a theater designed to show widescreen, 70 mm movies the ArcLight features 14 screens and assigned seating. ArcLight is a movie fan's theater, with a combination of first run and classic movie screenings.

Barnsdall Art Park (barnsdallartpark.com)

A national historic landmark, docent-led tours of the Frank Lloyd Wright-designed Hollyhock House are available Friday through Sunday. On Wednesday afternoons there is also a farmers' market. Admission: \$7 general; \$3 senior; \$2 youth

Bronson Canyon 3200 Canyon Drive (long walk or medium cab ride)

Featuring several hiking trails, Bronson Canyon was the perfect backdrop during the Golden Age of Hollywood for several films, including the science fiction classic "Invasion of the Body Snatchers" and the Batcave entrance for the 1960s Batman TV series. There is minimal shade, so morning and late afternoon are the best times to go.

A large municipal park in Los Feliz, Griffith Park features numerous hiking trails, merry-go-round, horseback riding and other activities. Admission to the park grounds and the observatory building is FREE.

Los Angeles Conservancy Walking Tours (lac.laconservancy.org)

The Conservancy offers a variety of walking tours and starting locations; the Art Deco tour is highly recommended. Admission price: \$10 general public, \$5 for Conservancy members

Hollywood's oldest cemetery features a who's who of old Hollywood, including Rudolph Valentino, among others. The cemetery is now also a venue to watch movies and a trendy concert venue – in the past few

years acts such as The Flaming Lips and Belle and Sebastian have both performed. Ticket prices vary by activity.

* **Los Angeles Zoo** (lazoo.org) (long cab ride or car required)

The Los Angeles Zoo is home to over 1,100 animals and is owned and operated by the City of Los Angeles. Admission prices: \$17/general public; \$12/children

△ **Runyon Canyon** (Medium cab ride or car required) A park just north of the hotel where you can enjoy hiking and great views of the city

Santa Monica Palisades Park (across town – long car ride or bus ride)

A public park featuring picnic tables and rose gardens.

Santa Monica Pier (santamonicapier.org) (across town – long car ride or bus ride) Very touristy, classic view of Los Angeles – the Ferris wheel and amusement park is classic southern California. Admission to the pier is free but parking and other amusement activities have additional costs.

Space Shuttle Endeavor (Across the street from Expo Park/USC Blue Line stop) In October 2012 the space shuttle Endeavor arrived at the California Science Center. It is open to public visitation in its temporary home. Free admission but tickets are required.

Universal Studios (universalstudioshollywood.com) (Free shuttle from Universal City Red Line Stop) An amusement park and working film studio, Universal Studios features multiple attractions and is located adjacent to **Universal City Walk**

(universalstudioshollywood.com/citywalk) and the **Gibson Amphitheatre** (gibson-amphitheatre.net) City Walk is free admission. Admission to Universal Studios is currently \$80 for adults with upgrades available.

△ **Upright Citizens Brigade** (losangeles.ucbtheatre.com) (short cab ride)

The west coast branch of the famous New York theater offers cheap fun, relatively short performances (1-2 hours). Very popular, so advanced RSVPs are recommended.

Venice Beach (venicebeach.com) (across town – long car ride). Offers some of the most offbeat people watching, a boardwalk, and proximity to the eclectic and exclusive Abbot Kinney shopping area.

Beverly Center (long cab ride) (beverlycenter.com)

The Grove (thegrovela.com) (long cab ride) Adjacent to the Original Farmers' Market, the Grove features lots of precious people watching. If you would like to be on television, "Extra" is filmed at the Grove on weekdays

△ **Hollywood and Highland**

Adjacent to the WPSA conference hotel, Hollywood and Highland features shopping, nightlife, dining, and the opportunity to access Mann's Chinese Theater and other tourist landmarks. Costumed characters will pose for photos but often expect tips in return.


