WELCOME!

On behalf of the University of San Diego and the local arrangements committee, it is our pleasure to welcome you to San Diego. We hope that you learn and grow at the conference and also have some well-deserved fun while you are here. San Diego calls itself “America’s Finest City,” and backs up that claim with great weather, diverse people, and a number of world-famous cultural and tourist attractions.

Populated by native peoples like the Kumeyaay for thousands of years, San Diego was “discovered” by Europeans in 1542 and settled by Spanish missionaries in 1769. Today, San Diego is home to 1.3 million people and is the eighth largest city in the United States. Like California, San Diego now boasts a majority-minority population (45% White/non-Hispanic, 29% Latino, 16% Asian, 7% Black in the 2010 census). Politically, the city itself has become more liberal in the last decade, and now a majority of its city council seats are held by Democrats. The northern and eastern suburbs, however, remain conservative. Five congressional districts span the county—two are solidly Democratic, two solidly Republican, and one, the 52nd, has lately been a perennial toss-up race.

The economy is diverse, although it is also true that San Diego has long been, and continues to be, a military town. About one in five jobs in the San Diego area is tied to the military or to military contracting. However, there is also a strong academic presence (San Diego State, the University of California, San Diego, the University of San Diego, California State University San Marcos, a vibrant, multi-campus community college system, and other small, private colleges), with the innovation and high-tech industry development that universities can generate. San Diego is home to a number of biotechnology and pharmaceutical firms, and to the high-tech companies Qualcomm and Nokia. The county has also become a center for the craft brewing industry led by Stone and Ballast Point.

Not surprisingly, given its average 70 degree temperature (year round), tourism is also important to the local economy. National Geographic Traveler magazine has selected San Diego/Tijuana as one of 20 “Best of the World” destinations for 2016. Indeed, San Diego is one of the best places in America to vacation. From the clean, sunny beaches, to the kid-friendly animal attractions like the Safari Park and Zoo, to the museums and theaters in Balboa Park, our city has something fun to offer nearly every traveler.

We hope you enjoy the conference, and while you are here, that you take some time to enjoy some of the sun and fun that San Diego has to offer.

Theme: The Politics of Identity, Intergroup Bias, and Conflict and Cooperation

The 2017 Annual Meeting marks the 70th anniversary of the Western Political Science Association. To mark this important occasion, our theme for this year's meeting is identity politics, a topic of great importance to many WPSA members.

Politics involves people defining themselves, and others, into social and political categories. Since political identities are essential to perception, self-identification and labeling others is central to political conflict and cooperation. In politics, race, ethnicity, nationality, gender, class, religion, and party, to name a few, define who we and others are. Some identities, such as race and ethnicity, are habitually salient in highly segmented polities whereas other identities, such as party, may ebb and flow depending on context. Multiple social identities, or intersectionality, may figure prominently depending on context and the motivations of the actors involved.

The politics of identity can be hugely consequential. Sometimes identity draws people together while other times it can pull them apart. Perceiving others to share a common identity minimizes perceived differences and viewing others as an outgroup increases perceived differences. Multiple, reinforcing identities can exacerbate perceived similarities or differences whereas cross-cutting identities

may attenuate these perceptions. Problems stemming from the politics of identity differences include intergroup bias, prejudice, intergroup conflict, and increased social and political distance. Yet, shared identities can diminish the adverse effects of intergroup differences such as prejudice and exclusion.

Questions of identity can be highly informative to the study of politics. “Us” versus “them” distinctions, for example, can be a powerful lens for understanding ethno-political conflict, collective action, voting behavior, party polarization, international conflict, immigration, and income inequality. We invite scholars of all methodological persuasions and subfield affiliations to submit panel and paper proposals that relate to the broad themes and questions informed by identity politics and related topics.

Note: All participants in the program are required to preregister for the meeting by December 31, 2016.

Note: Winter storms sometimes bring “high surf warnings.” Do take heed, as strong, high surf and rip currents can be dangerous on the beach or in the water. Also, after high surf or rain, beaches sometimes experience bacterial contamination. Before going in the water, it is best to check the website maintained by San Diego Coastkeeper. They also have a downloadable app, the “Waterkeeper Swim Guide”.

DAY TRIPS

TRAVELING TO LOS ANGELES and points north:

The LA area is about a 1 ½ hour drive at the best of times, however, travel time can vary *greatly* by day and time of day. Train to Los Angeles. The train ride takes just under 3 hours and prices range from \$35-\$70.

TRAVELING TO TIJUANA:

About Tijuana: Downtown San Diego is just a short drive from Tijuana (about 20-30 minutes), the largest and most dynamic Mexican city on the border. In the prohibition era, Tijuana grew from being a sleepy ranch town to become a major attraction for U.S. tourists seeking alcohol, gambling, and vice. In the post-war era, Tijuana began to emerge as a major center of Mexican industry, and today is known especially for its electronics, medical devices, automotive, and aerospace manufacturing and assembly plants or *maquiladoras*. Now home to over 1.3 million inhabitants and reputed to be the “world’s most visited city,” Tijuana still has much to offer tourists interested in shopping, traditional and innovative cuisine, and nightlife. For those with more than a day to spare, Tijuana also provides a convenient point of access to the incredible beaches, deserts, and natural areas throughout the rest of Baja California.

How to Get There: Before you go to Mexico, make sure you have your passport—and, if a foreigner, your U.S. visa information (an I-94 and a multiple-entry visa)—in order to cross the border back to the United States. No Mexican visa is needed to enter Tijuana, provided that you will stay for less than 72 hours and plan to stay within 90 miles of the border. If you are traveling by car, you will need to obtain Mexican driver’s insurance, which can be done in advance or once you cross to Tijuana. If you wish to park your car on the U.S. side and walk across into Mexico on foot, you can take the last exit for the town of San Ysidro and pay a reasonable sum (~\$10-20/day) at one of the nearby lots, then following the signs to the border. If you do not have a car, you can take the San Diego trolley to its last stop at the town of San Ysidro, and then follow signs to the border.

What to Do: Most first-time visitors make a point of visiting Avenida Revolución, which is lined with bars and shops that cater to tourists from around the world. Avenida Revolución is located within walking distance (about 15-20 minutes) or a very short (~\$5 cab ride) from the San Ysidro port of entry. For a different cultural experience, other visitors head to the Centro Cultural de Tijuana and the nearby Mercado Hidalgo, an outdoor market with fruits, vegetables, cookware, and handicrafts. Tijuana has increasingly attracted more adventurous travelers because of its exquisite restaurant scene.

Precautions: The primary concern for most first time visitors is safety, and visitors should review U.S. State department warnings to evaluate the risks. Tijuana developed a reputation for crime and violence because of its role as a conduit for drug trafficking and because of the dramatic surge in homicides that occurred there in 2008-2009. However, with proper precautions tourists have little to fear, as these problems have subsided substantially and tourists are generally not targets for major violent crimes. Indeed, New Orleans, Kansas City, St. Louis, or Washington, D.C. all have homicide rates much higher than Tijuana's. Tourists are certainly vulnerable targets for other kinds of crime, so travelers should take sensible precautions to avoid petty crimes, swindling, and sexual assault.

General Tips:

*Many people in Tijuana speak English, but try to remember you are not in the United States and act accordingly.

*Whether a taxi or a vendor, always ask about prices (twice!) before entering into a deal.

*In addition to their passports, travelers enrolled in trusted travel programs (e.g., SENTRI, GOES) should bring their cards with them for expedited return across the border.

*Don't forget your passport and/or U.S. visa.

*Coming back to the U.S. may involve substantial wait times.

*Review the U.S. Customs regulations on their website.
